President Bill Clinton Endorses Lundy Foundation Efforts for African Children

President Bill Clinton will offer his endorsement on March 4 when bipartisan supporters of the Colorado-based Lundy Foundation gather in Boulder, Colorado, to raise funds for Lundy's work with the Rockefeller Foundation, on behalf of AIDS orphans in Tanzania and other developing nations.

The Clinton Foundation's HIV/AIDS Initiative is helping African countries with large-scale treatment and prevention programs. The foundation's pediatric program is aimed at "the forgotten future of Africa" – children who have the disease or have lost parents to it.

Lundy's work to date has centered on the rural Tanzanian village of Idweli. Last spring, the foundation and its project partners opened the Idweli Children's Center, providing housing, medical care and a pre-school for village children.

The Lundy Foundation, supported by a \$150,000 matching grant from the Rockefeller Foundation, is now studying the Center's impact on Idweli's children and on the economic, social and cultural life of the village. Lundy is seeking funds to fulfill its financial obligation, as it moves forward in partnership with the Rockefeller Foundation to identify elements of the Idweli project that can be replicated elsewhere in Africa. The study's methodology also could provide a basis for more efficient resource allocation by other private and U.S. government organizations focusing on the well-being of orphaned and vulnerable children.
